In response to the successful Movement Lawyering conference put on by Advancement Project, the Thurgood Marshall Civil Rights Center, and Law for Black Lives, we invite you to submit **articles for publication** in what will be a special issue in the 5th Volume of the Howard Human & Civil Rights Law Review dedicated entirely to Movement Lawyering.

Topics must be movement lawyering related – any area is welcome as long as it discusses how power is being built around that issue as well as what the lawyers' role is in that work. Articles should be up to 15,000 words maximum, including footnotes. Shorter entries encouraged. We are also open to creative and non-traditional entries.

Authors are invited to submit an abstract of no longer than 250 words. Submissions will be considered on a **rolling basis until the EXTENDED deadline of Friday, May 15.**
