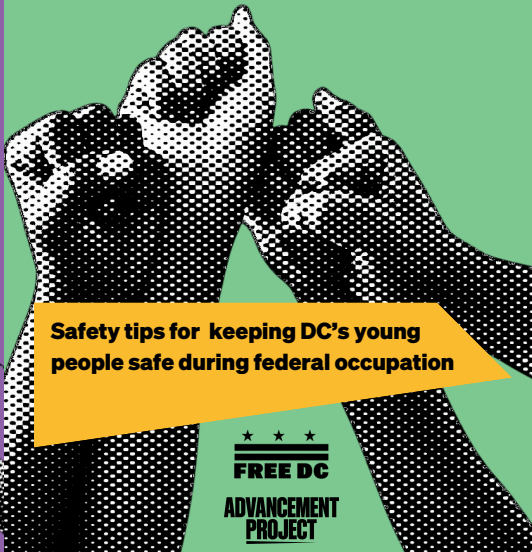

Recording is one way to document racial profiling or harassment of Black and brown youth.

They cannot take your phone or delete your videos without a warrant.

Stand at a safe distance and don't interfere with their work.

You can film police, National Guard, or any federal agents in public spaces.

"AM I FREE TO GO?"

If you are stopped, make sure to ask:

If you are approached by law enforcement, try to leave the conversation as quickly and safely as possible.

YOU HAVE RIGHTS IF STOPPED BY POLICE

ADDITIONAL SAFETY TIPS

Carry an ID if possible (but you don't have to show it unless required in specific situations).

Make sure your phone is charged and you have your Kids Ride Free card on you.

We keep us safe — travel with a friend or family member.

Write a legal aid number on your arm in case you're separated from your phone.



They may still search, but your refusal can help your lawyer fight it later.

"I do not consent to a search."

If asked to open your bag, pockets, or unlock your phone, say:

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO SAY NO TO A SEARCH

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO A LAWYER IF DETAINED

Black and brown youth deserve equal treatment under the law — speak your rights clearly and demand them.

If arrested, say: "I want a lawyer. I am staying silent."

Do not sign anything without a lawyer present.

If you're under 18, your parent or guardian must be contacted.
